

General Information

ENTRY FEES: \$30.00 per class unless otherwise indicated.

A \$10.00 post entry fee will be applied per class on all entries received or changed after the entries close 48 hours prior to show.

No numbers will be given out without fees paid in full, horse, rider, owner, trainer identification number, and a signed entry blank by the exhibitor and/or authorized agent and trainer. The show reserves the right to vary officials as well as to combine, cancel, or divide classes if entries so warrant. Classes with insufficient entries may be cancelled or combined.

SCRATCHES/REFUNDS: Scratches must be made in the office prior to the start of the division. If rider scratches at the horse show, a fee of \$35 will be charged.

STALLS: A limited number of permanent stalls with stall doors are available for \$30.00 per day. Initial bedding provided. You must provide hay, feed and any additional shavings. Please call in advance to reserve.

SCHOOLING SESSIONS: \$25

For the comfort and safety of our exhibitors and their horses all schooling in our show rings and schooling rings will be fully monitored. You must enter the show and wear a back number in order to school. A grounds fee and schooling fee will be charged. Schooling sessions *must start at 7AM in order to finish on time*.

Open-ticketed schooling in our main ring - \$25 plus grounds fee. Horse must be entered with a back number. Ring will be available whenever classes are not running during the day.

ASTM Approved protective headgear must be worn when riding anywhere on the grounds. Anyone riding on the grounds must have a signed entry blank in the office.

Jumping orders: Will be established with starter at each ring.

Trophies and eight ribbons are to be awarded in each class Championships and Reserve ribbons are offered in all divisions according to USEF rules.

Membership: It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have current membership for any and all classes they are entering.

Measurements are by appointment: please contact show office 24 hours prior to show to set up an appointment with the vet. Pony must be entered in the show that day to be measured.

USEF NOTES: All exhibitors in the Pony, Junior, Children's Hunter, and Amateur Every class offered herein which is covered by the specifications of the current USEF Rule Book Zone II, and the LIHSAA will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement, to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org."

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Schooling rings are sand footing approximately 100×120 . Horse show rings are all sand.

Sharps container will be located outside show office.

Prize money will be awarded day of show and will be deducted from entry blank.

USEF MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$45 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot (exception: Friesian performance FR222) and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Member Long Island High Score Awards Association. All points won at this show will count toward the annual Long Island High Score Awards. In order to be eligible for an award in any LIHSAA section, the horse, pony or rider must have shown in that section in at least six member shows

USHJA Zone Support Fee: Effective 12-01-09 a \$2.00 USHJA Zone Support Fee is to be charged to each horse entered at a Federation Licensed Hunter and/or Jumper competition. This fee shall be collected by the competition and remitted to the USHJA in accordance with GR1210.

Opportunity Classes- do not need to be a member of USHJA & USEF. Riders/drivers/handler entered only in these classes are exempt from the Federation membership requirements and are not required to pay a non-member fee but are required to list the Federation membership number if the participant is a member. Horses, Ponies and Riders may not cross enter in to any other classes at the same competition.

ACADEMY CLASSES

2020-22 Long Island Horse Show Series for Riders with Disabilities (LIHSSRD)

Riders will be judged on their performance during each class. Judging criteria consists of rider balance, seat, use of aids, horsemanship, control of horse, ring etiquette, safety, sportsmanlike conduct, suitability of the horse/rider match and the position of the rider. Judges may ask for posting trot, sitting trot, and two-point position and all USEF beginner tests including asking horsemanship questions to the riders (Suggested reference is United States Pony Club: Basics for Beginners D Manual). Riders unable to perform any task asked of them due to physical limitations may describe the action to the judge. Riders must have a documented disability, and submit an information sheet with proof of eligibility with their first entry of the season. Riders who have competed in recognized divisions are ineligible. The top 10 riders in each division who participate in a minimum of three (3) LIHSSRD events during the year will be invited to compete in the finals at the Hampton Classic Horse Show. Class fee is \$35 per class. Competing riders will be required to submit a yearly Rider Information Sheet and Membership Form at first show of season. All LIHSSRD entries with payment must be received by the HorseAbility office 1 week prior to the show. Send entries to: HorseAbility-LIHSSRD, PO Box 410-1, Old Westbury, NY 11568. Incomplete entries will not be processed. Entry forms must be completed for each show with payment one week prior to the date of the show. Post entry fee is \$15 per class and LIHSSRD management reserves the right not to accept entries after the due date.

EQUITATION, with Aides Open to adult and junior riders who require the assistance of a leader or leader and sidewalker. Riders must have a leader holding onto the horse, or a leader & sidewalker(s) in this division. Rider will choose one of 3 tests for class # 3. Test is to be performed at the walk and will be weighted. 1) Walk 2) Walk/Trot 3) Walk/Trot/Test (choice of figure 8, pole course, or horsemanship test)

EQUITATION, Spotter/Independent Open to adult and junior riders who ride independently or who request the use of a spotter. Spotters are to remain at a minimum distance of 5-10 feet from the rider, and may stand at horses head while lined up. Diagonals may be counted at the discretion of the judge. Riders will trot individually. Riders will choose one of 3 tests for class # 6. Test may be performed at the walk or the trot and will be weighted. 4) Walk 5) Walk/Trot/Test (choice of figure 8, pole course, or horsemanship test)

EQUITATION, Independent Open to adult and junior riders who ride independently. Riders may have an assistant in the center of ring if they need directions repeated or signed. Diagonals and leads may be counted at the discretion of the judge. Riders are to group trot. Riders will choose one of 4 tests for class #8. Test must be performed at the trot and will be weighted. Riders may enter 3 classes and may not enter both classes 9 and 10. Class 9 and 10 may be combined if there are less than 3 entries in either class. What is Jr.O ?: This unique competition brings the aspect of team competition to a normally individual sport. The team spirit, mutual support and magnitude of enthusiasm make this a truly exceptional experience. Teams of three horses and riders compete all day earning points for their team.

TEAM SPECIFICATIONS: Each team is made up of 3 riders.

Open to horses & ponies. Juniors and Adults may all ride on a team together (except D Teams)

RIDER SPECIFICATIONS: Professionals are only eligible for A or B Teams.

Adults can only ride on A, B, or C Teams.

D Team riders must be under 18.

HORSE SPECIFICATIONS: Horses may compete on more than one team.

<u>A TEAM:</u> Open to any riders- Juniors, Adult Amateurs or Professionals, regardless of show experience. **Two Sections — 2'9" Section and 3' Section**

<u>B TEAM:</u> Open to any riders- Juniors, Adult Amateurs or Professionals, regardless of show experience. Fences 2'3-2'6" Riders must be not have shown higher than 3' at a Recognized Show.

C TEAM: Fences 18' Riders must not have shown higher than 2'6" at a Recognized Show.

<u>D TEAM:</u> Fences are X Rails. Riders must not have shown higher than 2' at a Recognized show. D Team Riders must be under 18.

E TEAM: Pole Courses Riders must not have shown higher than WTC individual x rail at a recognized show.

ENTRY FEES: A,B,C,D \$190.00 per member includes USEF drug fees of \$23 per horse (covers 5 classes: 3 Team classes, Warm Up Round. Riders not required to be members of USEF or USHJA. No non-member fees will be charged. RIDERS DO NOT HAVE TO BE MEMBERS OF USEF. Non member fees will therefore, not be charged. USEF drug

fees are charged.
